Despite the good progress made, almost 900 million people still do not have access to safe water and some 2.6 billion lack access to adequate sanitation. With Asia and Africa expected to experience the most explosive urban growth in the next 30 years, safe water supply and sanitation is integral to building clean, sustainable and healthy cities.
